Tips For an Enjoyable RG

Badges: Please wear your badge at all times in any of our spaces (Hospitality, 1st floor meeting rooms and boardroom, and 2nd floor suites). Many of you will think this stinks. It also recorded traffic going by, a neighbor's generator tests, helicopters, quarry blasting, and even a meteor explosion over New Hampshire. It's not a toy. He still hasn't recorded a wind turbine. His presentation will have traces from the list above and he'll describe how thousands of these units have opened new avenues in citizen science.
